Independent Assurance Statement to ConocoPhillips

Our conclusion

Based on our activities, nothing has come to our attention to indicate that the following data for the $1^{\rm st}$ January $2021-31^{\rm st}$ December 2021 reporting period, as presented in sections C6.1, C6.3 and C6.5 of the CDP Questionnaire, are not fairly presented in all material respects, in accordance with the reporting criteria:

Total Scope 1 GHG emissions: 17,720,000 metric tonnes CO_2e

Total location-based Scope 2 GHG emissions: 1,000,000 metric tonnes CO₂e

Total Scope 3 GHG emissions from the four categories listed under 'Scope of our assurance engagement': 224,600,000 metric tonnes CO₂e

Our assurance activities

Our objective was to assess whether the GHG emissions data are reported in accordance with the reporting criteria based on the principles of completeness, accuracy and consistency. We planned and performed our work to obtain all the information and explanations that we believed were necessary to provide a basis for our assurance conclusion. A team of GHG and assurance specialists performed the following activities:

- Interviews with staff at the ConocoPhillips corporate level responsible for collecting and reporting the GHG emissions data to understand and evaluate the data management systems and processes (including internal review processes) used for collecting and reporting the GHG emissions data;
- An analytical review of the activity data underlying the GHG emissions:
- Virtual site visits to three selected ConocoPhillips operations in the United States of America, Canada and Norway, to review evidence at the operational level for the 2021 activity data for the Scope 1 and Scope 2 GHG emissions, and to assess the data management procedures at the operational level:

- A review of the calculations of the Scope 1, Scope 2 and Scope 3 GHG emissions from underlying activity data, including the conversion factors and emission factors used, and the accuracy of the consolidation of the GHG emissions data at the ConocoPhillips corporate level;
- A review of the results of ConocoPhillips' internal QA/QC procedures on the GHG emissions data; and
- A review of the presentation of the 2021 GHG emissions data in sections C6.1, C6.3 and C6.5 of the CDP Questionnaire to ensure consistency with our findings.

The limitations of our engagement

The reliability of the assured information is subject to inherent uncertainties, given the available methods for determining, calculating or estimating the underlying information. It is important to understand our assurance conclusion in this context.
