

RESPONSE PARTNERSHIPS AND INDUSTRY ALLIANCES

ConocoPhillips has established mutual aid arrangements and alliances with many other oil and gas companies around the world, especially in areas where our facilities operate near one another. We also make a concerted effort to work collaboratively with a wide variety of government agency response organizations that have jurisdiction for our assets across the globe. In addition, ConocoPhillips actively participates in a variety of more formal, cooperative efforts focused on crisis and emergency management. Here is a brief description of many of those groups, along with links to their websites.

- Alaska Clean Seas (<u>ACS</u>) protects the environment by providing effective response services to the Alaska North
 Slope Crude Oil Producers and the first 167 miles of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System in accordance with the
 oil spill response agreements and plans. With offices in Anchorage and Prudhoe Bay, ACS strives to be
 recognized as a world leader in arctic land and marine oil spill response.
- Australian Marine Oil Spill Center (<u>AMOSC</u>) provides rapid response to safeguard the Australian coastline with
 oil spill resources and equipment. AMOSC can respond 24/7 to marine oil spills, providing skilled personnel
 with equipment capable of containing and recovering all oil types.
- Clean Gulf Associates (<u>CGA</u>) is a not-for-profit cooperative based in New Orleans that provides oil spill
 response resources and personnel in the Gulf of Mexico for 90 member companies.
- Marine Spill Response Corporation (<u>MSRC</u>) is the largest dedicated oil spill and emergency response
 organization in the United States. ConocoPhillips is a major customer of this not-for-profit group, based in
 Herndon, Va., and classified by the U.S. Coast Guard as an Oil Spill Removal Organization.
- Marine Well Containment Company (<u>MWCC</u>) strives to be continuously ready to respond to a deepwater well
 control incident in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico. Founded by ConocoPhillips and three other companies, this notfor-profit and Houston-based company now has 10 members, and membership is open to all oil and gas
 operators in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico.
- Oil Spill Global Response Network (<u>GRN</u>) is a coalition of major oil response companies operating throughout
 the world focused on maximizing the knowledge, expertise and preparedness of each participating response
 organization and sharing that with other participants. ConocoPhillips has access to this group though its
 membership in MSRC and other groups.
- Oil Spill Response Limited (<u>OSRL</u>) is an industry-owned cooperative which exists to respond effectively to oil
 spills wherever in the world they may occur. About 170 companies are members of this London-based group
 with strategic bases in the UK, Singapore and Bahrain, and regional offices in the UK, USA, Indonesia, North
 Africa and West and Central Africa.
- Subsea Well Intervention Services (<u>SWIS</u>) is OSRL's dedicated subsea division, providing members with access
 to full subsea intervention capability, including well capping and containment services. SWIS aims to enhance
 the industry's ability to prepare for and respond to a subsea well control incident wherever it occurs.
- Western Canadian Spill Services Ltd. (<u>WCSS</u>) provides spill preparedness and response support services that
 meet regulatory requirements for licensees of wells and pipelines that are members in good standing of WCSS
 oil spill cooperatives in Alberta, NE British Columbia and Saskatchewan.
